#5 War-induced Soil Contamination: how to recover the most fertile soils of Europe?

#### Aims:

- To present ALDA's work in Ukraine, including the project "Local Democracy Agencies (LDAs): An Instrument for Cooperation, Community Cohesion, and Development in Ukraine", implemented by ALDA European Association for Local Democracy with the support of U-LEAD with Europe, within the framework of the Bridges of Trust initiative), and its role in promoting green reconstruction efforts to ALDA members and the broader public
- ➤ Increase awareness among international and local stakeholders about the scale and impact of soil contamination and biodiversity loss in Ukraine, highlighting the urgent need for green reconstruction efforts.
- Provide a platform for experts and local communities to share their knowledge, experiences, and best practices related to soil contamination, biodiversity loss, and nature conservation during times of conflict.
- ➤ Inform stakeholders about EU support programmes, empower rural communities, and establish follow-up mechanisms to monitor progress and ensure ongoing collaboration.
- Outline clear, actionable steps and recommendations for addressing soil contamination and biodiversity loss in Ukraine, emphasizing the importance of immediate and long-term interventions.
- > Strengthen the capacity of local communities, government agencies, and environmental organizations to effectively address environmental challenges through training, knowledge exchange, and resource mobilization.

### **Expected results:**

- ➤ Participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of the extent and impact of soil contamination and biodiversity loss in Ukraine, informed by data and assessments from international and Ukrainian experts.
- > Stakeholders, including rural communities, will be well-informed about EU support programmes and feel empowered to participate in environmental initiatives, with follow-up mechanisms established to monitor progress and ensure continuous collaboration.
- ➤ Enhanced capacity among local communities, government agencies, and environmental organizations to tackle environmental challenges through targeted training, knowledge exchange, and effective resource mobilization.
- ➤ Additionally, the event will lead to the development and dissemination of clear, actionable steps and recommendations for addressing soil contamination.
